The Valley Center Municipal Water District Board of Directors' meeting was called to order by President Polito at 2:00 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Board members present were: Directors Polito, Haskell, Broomell, Ferro and Holtz. 2. <u>Award of Construction Contract for the Betsworth Forebay No. 1 and Red Mountain Reservoir Painting and Recoating Project:</u>

The Betsworth Forebay No. 1 and Red Mountain Reservoir Painting and Recoating Project consists of the cleaning, remedial repair, interior coating, and exterior painting reported District Engineer Grabbe. Betsworth was last coated in 2000 and is showing some corrosion. Red Mountain Reservoir was last coated in 1986. Its center support and rafters are showing significant deterioration.

The Engineer's estimate for this project was \$380,000. Three project bids were received as follows:

J. Colon Coatings	\$330,200
AMP United	\$333,102
Olympos Painting	\$683,368

This project is expected to take 110 calendar days with the completion expected by the end of July 2018. The construction on the reservoirs would be staggered two weeks apart to allow for inspections. According to plan, Red Mountain will be off-line from April 9th through July 18, 2018; Betsworth Forebay will be off-line from April 25th through July 27, 2018. Because Red Mountain is the sole storage facility within this pressure zone, a temporary pump system will be installed during the work.

Staff recommends adoption of Resolution No. 2018-07 awarding the construction contract to J. Colon Coatings for their low bid of \$330,200.

3. Ordinance No. 2018-03 Amending Administrative Code Sections 160.23 and 160.27 to Clarify Fire Service Meter Requirements:

At the February 5, 2018 Board meeting, staff discussed conditions that may warrant allowing the requirement for a separate fire service meter to be waived. Following that discussion and comments received from General Counsel, amendments to Administrative Code Sections 160.23 – Residential Fire Service, and 160.27 – Conditions of Service are being requested.

The amendment would allow the requirement for a separate fire service meter to be waived for the following specific conditions:

Residences with Private Booster Pumps

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- Remote Meter Installations more than 200 feet from residence
- Home has existing fire sprinkler system installed prior to the requirement
- Property has other water source approved by governing fire district
- Fire sprinkler system is being required for a detached structure that will not be occupied

In addition, waivers would be subject to verifying that the existing service lateral is sufficient in size and the property owner signs a "Release and Indemnification Agreement" with the District.

Staff recommended adoption of Ordinance No. 2018-03 amending Administrative Code Sections 160.23 and 160.27 to specify conditions for which the separate fire service meter requirement may be waived.

4. Review of Proposed Administrative Code Amendments Regarding Individual Water Meters for Multi-Unit Residential Structures, Separate Irrigation Meters and Meter Relocations:

Proposed amendments to the Administrative Code clarifying water meter requirements for three specific areas were presented by District Engineer Grabbe. They included:

- Separate irrigation meters for commercial, industrial and institutional developments to better monitor water use for compliance with demand restrictions;
- Requiring individual water meters for each new residential unit of a multi-unit residential structure to comply with new legislation (SB7); and
- Allows for meter relocations between properties of the same ownership.

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Staff will incorporate the comments received and finalize the proposed Administrative Code recommendations for adoption at a future meeting.

5. <u>Resolution Approving the District's Statement of Investment Policy and Renewing the Authority Delegated to the Treasurer:</u>

Review of the District's investment policy by the Board of Directors is required annually by Government Code Section 53646(a)(2) and Administrative Code Section 50.1(j). In addition, Government Code Section 53607 requires the delegation of investment authority be reconfirmed by the Board annually.

The District's investment policy has three objectives reported Finance Director Pugh:
1) the safety and preservation of capital, 2) the liquidity to meet cash flow requirements, and 3) an investment yield at least equal to the average rate of U.S. Treasury Bonds.

Staff recommended approving the District's Statement of Investment Policy with one minor correction in Section 50.1(g)F, and renewing the authority delegated to the Treasurer, who is also the Director of Finance, to invest and reinvest District funds.
